## Holocaust Memorial Day Thursday, 24<sup>th</sup> January 2019

Over the last few years, the Council and its partners have commemorated Holocaust Memorial Day by holding a service in Solihull. The service has developed year on year. The aim is for this Memorial Day to continue in 2019, involving Solihull's schools and colleges.

**Torn from home** is the theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2019. The theme for HMD 2019 encourages audiences to reflect on how the enforced loss of a safe place to call 'home' is part of the trauma faced by anyone experiencing persecution and genocide.
