## **Training opportunities**

### Funding for pupils with English as an additional language:

- The funding a school receives is driven by the October census.
- The rates for 2018-19 are £516.70 per eligible primary pupil and £1,389.58 per eligible secondary pupil.
- Funding has already been received in school as part of this year's budget.
- There is no in-year funding.

Funding is for current EAL pupils who have been in the UK school system for three years or less. Although it is part of the whole school budget and is not ring-fenced, we are strongly urging schools to consider this when planning for EAL learners in schools.

# Collection of proficiency in English (PiE) codes (all schools)

Following consultation with SSSAB, the EAL service has decided to continue collecting PiE codes. The reasons for this are:

- Assessment of English proficiency, empowers teachers to understand, and therefore better meet, the learning needs of their EAL learners.
- Schools in Solihull have improved greatly in identifying their EAL learners as a direct consequence of this requirement.
- These data also allow the service to identify trends and therefore target resources, training and support more effectively.
- Collection of PiE data will also inform our risk assessments

The service will contact schools during the week beginning 3 June 2019 and will send a template (by email) for schools to complete and return. The data is required for pupils from year 1 upwards. Many of you will already have the information and will simply need to complete the template and email it back to us.

You can use SIMS to update PiE and there is information about how to do this on the EIMS pages of the extranet <a href="here">here</a>. Linked to this, EIMS has produced a SIMS report definition form which you can import into your SIMS system. The report is available <a href="here">here</a> (this link is a direct link to a SIMS report definition file for installation).
