Wildlife Ways

- A £16.8 million project, part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund, to make Solihull even greener through new trees, the creation of wildflower areas and bulb planting
- Widening and connecting existing paths and cycle routes with green spaces
- We've planted to date 800 trees and 3.5 million bulbs
- 110,000sqm of wildflowers have been planted
- Improved 175 hectares of land to date – equal to 280 football pitches

Wildlife Ways

- Engage with community groups, individuals and schools
- Autumn 2019 – local schools invited to do bulb planting in local parks
- St Anthony's, Yorkswood, St Augustine's, Monkspath schools took part
- Planted crocus and snowdrops at Hillfield, Tudor Grange and Babbs Mill parks
- Be part of the project – own your own flower patch!
