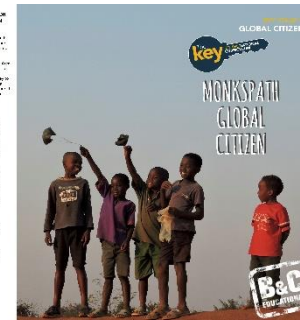
This year some of the keyworker children took part in the schools birdwatch which helped us complete the Silver level of the RSPB Wild Challenge.**SDG15**
