Sustainability and Climate Change Strategy



1. Climate education

- Focus on providing support to ensure excellent teaching in climate change and a greater emphasis on nature.
- This will ensure all children and young people have robust knowledge.
- Practical co-curricular opportunities will enable young people to translate knowledge into positive action.

Specific actions include;

- From 2022, include sustainability in science teacher's CPD
- From 2023, a primary science model curriculum will have an emphasis on nature
- From 2023, provide free access to high-quality curriculum resources through Nature Park hub
- From 2025: Natural History GCSE
- National Education Nature Park and Climate Leaders Award.

The National Education Nature Park — what is it?

A concept

- Bringing together all the education estate (from nurseries to Uni)
- Each setting forming part of a virtual National Park.

A mapping and monitoring tool

- Recording baseline biodiversity for example through pupil-led surveys
- Engaging children and yp in citizen science and mapping will help develop numeracy and other skills

An **online hub-** education resources to support learning **delivery route** – simplifying access to existing and new funds for biodiversity improvement


