Course details

What will you learn?

You will gain a better understanding and awareness of autism and the way it affects children in your setting on this half-day course.

Aims

This course will help you to:

- extend your understanding of how autism affects children in the early years
- increase your expertise in recognising a child's individual strengths and differences
- develop your skills in identifying barriers to learning for autistic children
- develop your understanding of what "reasonable adjustments" need to be made to support an autistic child in your setting

Outcomes

After completing this course, you will be able to:

- approach autism as a difference rather than as a disorder or impairment
- recognise the three areas of difference for autistic children and how these can affect a child
- listen to and learn from the perspectives of autistic children and their parents/carers
- reflect on your practice and implement reasonable adjustments to support autistic children

Who is this training for?

This is a raising awareness module, for anyone working in early years settings. This includes teaching and support staff, office and ancillary staff, caterers, caretakers, transport staff and governors.
