

Solihull's MARF form has been reviewed and updated. The improvements to the form have been consulted upon and agreed across the Safeguarding Partnership. The parental engagement and consent guide has also been updated which sits alongside this to provide additional information and assurance about our expectations when a referral is considered.

Solihull Workforce and volunteers survey for Child Sexual Abuse practice

We are working together to implement the Centre of Expertise on Child Sexual Abuse response pathway into the West Midlands multi-agency safeguarding procedures, and embed it in Solihull multi-agency practice, to create a consistent approach for any children who are experiencing any type of sexual abuse.
