

Early Years Foundation Stage Reforms Implementation support for local authorities

Background

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) reforms consultation was launched on 24 October 2019 and the government response to the consultation, outlining the final reforms, was published on 1 July 2020.

The early adopter year will still go ahead as planned from September 2020, with national implementation from September 2021.

Therefore, the new EYFS framework will apply for early adopter schools in 2020/21 and for all providers from September 2021.

- New Early Adopter Early Years Foundation Stage statutory framework
 The EYFS statutory framework sets the standards that all early years
 providers must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well and are
 kept healthy and safe. This version of the framework is mandatory for early
 adopter schools only in England from 1 September 2020. This content will be
 the same for statutory implementation in 2021/22, with the addition of
 promoting oral health which doesn't apply to the EA year.
- New Early Adopter Early Years Foundation Stage handbook
 This non-statutory assessment guidance handbook has been produced to
 help teachers make accurate judgements about each child's attainment at the
 end of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), and to detail the statutory
 requirements for the EYFS profile assessment. This version has been
 produced for schools participating in the EYFS reforms early adopter year
 from September 2020, but the content will be the same for national
 implementation in 2021/22.

We are taking the opportunity to re-focus this guidance on curriculum, so that it is not used a tracking document to the ELGs. The key objectives of this work are to improve early years outcomes, reduce workload burdens and to use this as an opportunity to develop specific guidance for reception year that sits clearly within the EYFS but links fluidly with the national curriculum.
