

Resources- Rotation to support learning

- Rotate resources to keep the space calm, engaging, and uncluttered.
- Select items based on children's interests, developmental needs, schemas, and next steps.
- Rotation keeps play fresh meaningful, and purposeful.
- Use simple examples (e.g., small-world ↔ construction, seasonal items).
- Show inspectors that resources are intentional, not excessive.
